

# Child Care Immunization Requirements

The **Florida Certification of Immunization, Form DH 680**, must be used to document the immunizations required for entry and attendance in Florida Schools, Child Care Facilities and Family Day Homes.

Directions:

- Find the child's age/grade level and read across to the right.
- Look to see whether the child had the number of shots shown by the checkmark(s) under each vaccine.
- Note: Each row is meant to be read separately, do not add the columns of checkmarks under each vaccine.

Example: A preschool child ages two and three, is required to have 4 DTaP's, then to enter Kindergarten one (1) more DTaP required for a total of 5 (not 9).

\* Varicella shots not required if child has a history of varicella (chicken pox) disease. A second varicella shot required for Pre-Kg and Kindergarten (School Entry) in fall of 2008.

\*\* Prevnar vaccine required for child care attendance for children (2 to 59 months of age Effective January 1, 2012).

\*\*\* Hepatitis B Series required for Pre-Kg and Kindergarten (School Entry). Hepatitis B currently not required for child care.
