

**Florida Residency Requirements for Recipients of  
First Dose of COVID-19 Vaccine**

\_\_\_\_\_ Valid Florida Driver License or Florida Identification Card

**OR**

\_\_\_\_\_ **Two** of the following items:

\_\_\_\_\_ A deed, mortgage, monthly mortgage statement, mortgage payment booklet or residential rental or lease agreement. (Copies of deeds can be found on the Lee County Property Appraiser website <https://leepa.org/> )

\_\_\_\_\_ A utility hookup or work order that is not more than 2 months old.

\_\_\_\_\_ A utility bill that is not more than 2 months old.

\_\_\_\_\_ Mail from a bank or other financial institution, including checking, savings, or investment account statements, that is not more than 2 months old.

\_\_\_\_\_ Mail from a government agency that is not more than 2 months old. (Mail from a government agency can include tax bills showing a Florida address. Tax bills can be found on the Lee County Property Appraiser website <https://leepa.org/>)

\_\_\_\_\_ One proof of residential address from the seasonal resident's parent, step-parent or legal guardian or other person with whom the seasonal resident resides and a statement from the person with whom the seasonal resident resides stating that the seasonal resident does reside with him or her.

- Seasonal resident means any person who temporarily resides in this state for a period of at least 31 consecutive days in each calendar year, maintains a temporary residence in this state, returns to the state or jurisdiction of his or her residence at least one time during each calendar year, and is registered to vote or pays income tax in another state or jurisdiction.

Please note, the above residency requirements do **NOT** apply to health care providers or individuals presenting for their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.
